# Occupational Outlook Handbook (OOH) Background

■ Published in 1949 to provide career guidance to WWII veterans

looking to enter the civilian workforce

Published in print until 2012

■ The redesigned web-only version was released in March 2012

Also available as an app as of October 2019



■ Has over 300 occupational profiles with information on over 500 occupations, covering about 4 out of 5 jobs in the economy








#### **Career Outlook**

- Career Outlook is published throughout the year and includes practical information on jobs and careers
- Includes feature articles, interviews with workers, and "you're a what?" – describes careers people may not know about



#### **CHWs in the OOH**

- Stand alone OOH profile (New)
  - Previously combined with Health Education Specialists
- Added to the OOH in 2015
- 10-year employment projections data
  - ▶ 14% growth rate (compared to 3% for all occupations)
- Pay, employment and other BLS data
- Part of the community and social services section

### **Standard Occupational Classification**

- Standard Occupational Classification (SOC)
- Federal statistical standard
- 867 detailed occupations
- 459 broad occupations, 98 minor groups, and 23 major groups
- Last updated in 2018



#### **CHWs in the SOC**

- Added to the SOC as part of the 2010 update
  - ▶ Part of the Community and Social Service occupations group
- Definition updated as part of the 2018 update
- Future SOC update
  - ► Most likely 2028
  - ► Soliciting comments 2024
  - ► SOC@bls.gov

#### **Occupational Outlook Handbook**

#### > PURPOSE

- Separate the Health Education Specialists and Community Health Workers into two profiles
- Expand the Community Health Worker Profile
- Be inclusive of other professions (such as peer support specialists, community health representatives, promotores) also classified as CHWs by the United States Department of Labor

#### GOALS

- Better document the unique roles and duties of CHWs
- Defined the qualities of CHWs
- Outlined career advancements and opportunities for CHWs

- Published in 2015
- How to Become a Health Education
   Specialist or Community Health Worker
  - Health education specialists typically need at least a bachelor's degree.
  - Community health workers typically need at least a high school diploma and a brief period of on-the-job training. Certification may be required or preferred for some health education specialists and community health workers.

- Updated in 2023
- How to Become a <u>Community Health</u> <u>Worker</u>
  - To enter the occupation, community health workers typically need at least a high school diploma; some employers prefer to hire candidates who have postsecondary education. To attain competency, they typically complete a brief period of on-thejob training, and some states require certification.

# What Health Education Specialists and Community Health Workers Do

- Teach people about behaviors that promote wellness. They develop strategies to improve the well-being of individuals and communities.
- Community health workers advocate for residents' needs with healthcare providers and social service organizations.
- Implement wellness strategies by collecting data and discussing health concerns with members of specific populations. Although the two occupations often work together, the responsibilities of health education specialists and community health workers are distinct.

#### What Community Health Workers Do

 Promote wellness by helping people adopt healthy behaviors. They implement programs and advocate for people who may have limited access to health resources and social services.

# Community Health Workers Do the Following:

- Discuss health concerns with community members;
- Educate people about the importance and availability of healthcare services, such as cancer screenings;
- Provide basic health services such as first aid, diabetic foot checks, and height and weight measurements;
- Collect data to help identify community needs;

# Community Health Workers Do the Following:

- <u>Coordinate care</u> among individuals, communities, and health and social service systems;
- Conduct outreach, such as through home visits;
- Provide <u>culturally appropriate</u> health and informational resources;
- Oversee case management and resource access;
- Advocate for individuals and communities regarding housing, food security, and other needs;

# **Community Health Workers Do the Following:**

- Report findings to health education specialists, healthcare workers, or social service providers;
- Provide informal counseling and social support;
- Conduct outreach programs;
- Make referrals, provide transportation, and address other barriers to healthcare access, and
- Advocate for individual and community needs

# Community Health Workers Do the Following:

- Provide coaching and social support, such as nutrition training, recovery services for mental health and substance use disorders, and chronic disease management and prevention;
- <u>Provide services</u>, such as basic health screenings and first aid, and
- Increase individual and community participation in assessments and education to improve health and well-being

#### **Community Health Workers**

They may have different titles, depending on the population they serve.

- <u>Community health representatives</u> increase health knowledge and access to care for Tribal communities.
- <u>Promotores de la salud</u> reduce barriers to healthcare and social services in Spanishspeaking communities.
- <u>Peer support specialists</u> have experienced a mental health or substance use disorder and are in recovery while providing support to others experiencing similar challenges.

#### **Job Advancement**

- Overall employment of health education specialists and community health workers is projected to grow 13 percent from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations.
- Growth will be driven by efforts to improve health outcomes and to reduce healthcare costs by teaching people healthy behaviors and explaining how to use available healthcare services.

#### 2023

#### **Job Advancement**

- Employment of community health workers is projected to grow 14 percent from 2022 to 2032, much faster than the average for all occupations.
- About 8,000 openings for community health workers are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire.

How Community Health Workers Can Reinvent Health Care Delivery, Social Services, and Communities in the US?

- CHWs are the Bridge
- They wear many hats and have many titles
  - CHWs can be defined by what they are not!
    - CHWs are <u>not physician extenders</u>, <u>nor are they unskilled labor</u>.
  - Community Health Workers have a long and proud history of accomplished service in the U.S. and abroad in reaching traditionally underserved populations within communities that typically have both complex medical and social needs.

- Help non-CHW work colleagues and supervisors understand the roles and duties of CHWs
- Build appropriate CHW position descriptions based on specific duties and personal qualities outlined in the profile
- Increase public awareness of the CHW profession






